# WHAT IS THE SCHOOLS OF TOMORROW FELLOWSHIP?

The Schools of Tomorrow Fellowship is a non-profit support, research and development network for schools and school leaders. Our distinctive approach to quality, self-evaluation and school improvement has been developed by school leaders for school leaders.

Over 30 schools, across all phases, in England and overseas, have joined the programme and are benefitting from the focus and practical support it brings.

Fellowship schools use the Schools of Tomorrow Four Quadrant Framework as the basis for improvement planning, staffing structures and governor reporting, in a process that involves all stakeholder groups.

### **FELLOWSHIP SCHOOLS COMMIT TO:**

- Embedding the four-quadrant framework in their planning and review processes
- Engaging in mutual support and challenge from other Fellowship schools, making use of Gauging Success, a unique tool developed by our school leaders, to self-review progress and develop an annual impact report
- Building their levels of stakeholder engagement, with students, staff, parents and communities, and develop real conversations with them about purpose and quality
- Participating in a structured biennial half-day peer review with another Fellowship school

# **HOW DO I JOIN?**

There are two types of membership of Schools of Tomorrow.

### Associate membership

Is open to any school that shares our values and wishes to learn with and from others.

It costs £225 a year and entitles the school to:

- Nine ZoomMeet tickets additional ones may be purchased at £25 each
- Termly learning visit to a Fellowship school
- Mentoring and consultancy from a director
- Opportunity to join other events and activities at cost
- Option to become a full Fellowship school after two years

### **Full Fellowship**

Is open to any school that has completed a two-year induction, and affirmed its engagement to an ongoing values-led, research-informed partnership and to work for long-term change based around the four quadrant framework.

It costs £500 per school p.a. plus £1 per pupil.
